Covenant Partners have the privilege and responsibility to elect new deacons and elders at our Spring Congregational Meeting. Both deacons and elders ordinarily serve three-year terms, and they may serve two consecutive terms. Typically, 1/3 of our deacons and elders are elected each year.

Our Nominating Committee, after a season of prayerful discernment since February, has presented four elder-nominees and three deacon nominees. Included here are their faith statements. You will be encouraged to read how the Lord has been at work in these women and men!

The Constitution of ECO (Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians) outlines the ministry of elder and deacon as follows:

2.02 The Ministry of Elders. Elders are given authority and responsibility, along with pastors, to oversee the spiritual health of the congregation as well as the congregation's faithfulness to God's mission. Elders may also be asked to preach and teach. Elders shall be elected by the congregation.

2.03 The Ministry of Deacons. Ordinarily, the biblical office of deacon shall be utilized by the congregation. Deacons lead ministries that nurture fellowship and caregiving within and beyond the congregation. Deacons may also be asked to preach and teach. The congregation shall determine the manner in which they are selected for service. The session shall oversee and direct the ministry of the deacons.

During the 10:00am worship gathering, we will ordain and install these new elders and deacons, praying for and commissioning them to serve the Lord Jesus, who alone is head of the Church (Colossians 1:18). What a joy to have front row seats to the Holy Spirit's work in these disciples' lives!
